- o Wilden Acres Phase II Improvements
 - The easement agreements have been approved by both Bethlehem and Palmer Townships and will be recorded after ESWA executes the agreements.
 - Water main installation is scheduled to begin the week of March 11th, 2013, starting on Butternut Lane in Palmer Township.
- o Timberlane Drive Water Main Replacement
 - Construction will proceed as weather and manpower permits.
- o Plainfield Tank Painting and Modifications
 - The contractor is tentatively planning to return the week of March 25, 2013 to complete the painting of the exterior of the tank.
 - The work is anticipated to take approximately 6 weeks to complete.
- o Palmer Tank Altitude Valve Chamber
 - The piping passed the required hydrostatic and bacteria testing.
 - The altitude valve was installed on February 15, 2013 and was placed in service on February 28, 2013.
 - The Distribution Department will complete the 16" piping at the site, which includes the 16" bypass for the altitude valve and the abandonment of the existing chamber in the next few weeks.
 - The Maintenance Department will be running the electric and SCADA wiring into the new chamber over the next few weeks also.
 - Once the piping, electrical and telemetry work is completed, the driveway will be repayed and site will be reseeded.
- ESWA Office Emergency Generator
 - ESWA received the electrical permits for the electrical modifications that must be completed at the office for the use of the generator.
 - The electrical equipment has been ordered and a few items have a long lead time, so installation will begin once the equipment has been received.
