Authority Projects

- Wilden Acres Tank Painting
 - Contractor is looking to resume work in March.
 - ESWA staff waiting until Knox pump 3 is back in service.
 - Likely to resume week of March 21^{st} or 28^{th} .
 - Contractor anticipates work to be done in 3 weeks.
- Morgan Hill High Service Pump Station
 - \circ Pump 2 was refurbished and placed back in service on February 16th.
 - Pump 1 was removed for refurbishment and should be back in service in April.

- Knox Avenue Pump Station
 - Pump 3 was inspected and removed for repairs by Kohl Brothers on February 17th.
 - The impeller was found to be corroded and a coupling on the shaft needed to be repaired.
 - Kohl Brothers confirmed that the impeller was made of Silicon Brass and not Nickel Aluminum Brass, which is resistant to chlorinated water. With the Silicon Brass, the chlorinated water leaches the zinc from the alloy. (Same issue as with the WTP High Service)
 - Kohl Brothers reviewed pump records for all ESWA pump stations.
 - Pumps 3 and 4 at Knox Avenue and Pumps 1 and 2 at North High were found to have Silicon Brass Impellers.
 - ESWA ordered new Nickel Aluminum Impellers for all 4 pumps:
 - Knox Avenue Pumps 3 & 4
 - o \$10,175 Each, 12-14 Week Lead Time
 - o North High Pumps 1 & 2
 - o \$8,250 Each, 5-7 Week Lead Time
 - Pump 3 impeller being repaired and will be back in service week of March 14th.
- Lower Nazareth Service Laterals
 - Lower Nazareth Township will be performing full depth reclamation of pavement on Pine Drive, Locust Drive, Larch Lane and Spruce Lane in the summer of 2016.
 - ESWA personnel are replacing plastic service laterals in the proposed work area.
 - Excavating at main and curb stop to confirm the service lateral material. (No records from Lower Nazareth Township Municipal Authority)
 - Work Began the week of March 7th and should be completed in early April.
- Pavement Restoration
 - Keystone Consulting Engineers prepared a bid package for the restoration of pavement for 3 water system projects ESWA performed in the Fall of 2015.
 - \circ Bids were opened on Friday, March 11th.
 - Apparent lowest responsible bidder is Livengood Excavators, Inc. with a base bid of \$96,582.87.
 - ESWA staff is requesting approval of the low bid.
