- Begin shutoffs in 2nd Quarter (Bills due April, May & June)
 - o Balances due greater than \$800
 - o Must bring balance below \$600
- 3rd Quarter 2021 (Bills due July, August & September)
 - o Balance due greater than \$600
 - o Must bring balance below \$400
- 4th Quarter 2021 (Bills due October, November & December)
 - o Balance due greater than \$400
 - Must bring balance below \$200
- Late Fees to be assessed beginning with 3rd Quarter Billing (Start as of 7/1/21)
- Step procedure to be placed on past due notices & bills
 - o Send notification letters to all with past due balances.
