    - The meter has auto shut off capabilities

    - Water Temp sensors (water quality)
  - 7 Meters installed by ESWA staff, monitored by Sensus. Beta test will last about 2-3 months.
  - 1<sup>st</sup> Utility in world to have this meter system.
  - Ability to have input in final design and production on meter.
    They are taking our ideas. Installation, design, functionality ideas before final production.
  - Presenting at Sensus annual conference experience with meter and benefits of the meter in our system.
