- Route 611 & Bushkill Creek Bridge Replacement
 - Bridge Contractor began Phase 1 work in late March.
 - ESWA to coordinate water system work outside of PennDOT Project with Bridge Contractor.
- Freemansburg Avenue & Route 33 Bridge Project
 - St Luke's is looking into having the bridge contractor perform the water main relocations work.

 - ESWA personnel completed draining of West Reservoir so deteriorating drain line could be removed.
